NEW HAMPSHIRE DISABLED VETERANS LICENSE

100% Disability Rating Only

When applying for a Disabled Veteran license, the attached application must be completed. The applicant shall submit an award letter from the Veterans Administration, must contain the following information: permanent disability rating of 100%, and honorable discharge.

Along with the above documentation, you will also need proof of Residency; we require a copy of your valid New Hampshire driver's license or non-driver's photo ID issued from Division of Motor Vehicles. For nonresidents a valid Vermont or Maine driver's license or non-drivers photo ID is required.

Non Residents: Currently, only Maine and Vermont residents may apply for a New Hampshire Disabled Veterans License. Although ME and VT may have different criteria for this type of license, nonresident applicants must meet NH's requirements (100% permanent rating).

If you are requesting a hunting license, please provide a copy of your previously held hunting license from any state, province of Canada or country, or a copy of your Hunter Safety Certificate from any State Authorized Hunter Education Program. For Archery Licenses, a previously held archery license or Bow Education or Certificate.

The license issued is permanent; as long as you remain a resident of N.H. (or a resident of a reciprocal state). This is a Fishing License or a Combination Hunting (firearm) and Fishing License, and/or Archery License, all other license types must be purchased each year.

A \$10.00 one-time administration fee is required.

214:13 Permanently Disabled Veterans. -

I. If the applicant for a fishing, hunting, or bow and arrow license is a resident of the state, has received a discharge other than dishonorable from service in the armed forces of the United States as defined in RSA 21:50, II and is totally and permanently disabled from such service-connected disability, the executive director shall issue a special veteran's license to said applicant. Said license shall be perpetual. The executive director shall retain the records for such licenses for a period not less than 7 years. Loss or destruction of the license after 7 years shall obligate the licensee to reestablish eligibility. A \$10 administrative fee shall be charged once, upon application to the executive director for such license.

II. If the applicant for a fishing and hunting license is a resident of the state, has received a discharge other than dishonorable from service in the armed forces of the United States as defined in RSA 21:50, II and is at least 80 percent but not 100 percent permanently disabled from such service-connected disability, the executive director shall issue a lifetime license to such applicant at 50 percent of the cost of a lifetime license under RSA 214:9-c calculated pursuant to RSA 214:9-c, II.

21:50 Veteran; Armed Forces; Active Duty; Service-Connected Injury, Illness, or Disability. –

- I. (a) "Veteran" means any person who:
 - (1) Served in the United States armed forces for more than 4 years and continues to serve; or
 - (2) Has been discharged or released from duty in the United States armed forces with:
- (A) An honorable discharge; or
- (B) An uncharacterized discharge based on a service-connected injury, illness, or disability.
