

ANGLERS: Know The Law

New Hampshire State Law prohibits the sale and freshwater use of lead fishing sinkers and lead jigs weighing one ounce or less in New Hampshire.

A "lead jig" means a weighted hook that weighs one ounce or less and is prohibited regardless of whether it is painted, coated, covered by some other substance or by attached skirts.

Did you know?

Lead poisoning is the leading cause of death for adult Common Loons in New Hampshire.

Nearly half (48%) of adult loons collected over the last twenty-five years died from lead poisoning, a direct result of the ingestion of lead sinkers and lead-headed jigs. Lead is highly toxic and loons will die within two to four weeks after they ingest just one small lead object.
