Directions: Check with an adult about where you can safely do this assignment. Go outside and search for the Food, Water, Shelter, and Space items in the boxes below. You might not find everything in your outdoor space - that's okay. Circle the ones you do find.

5.	Flowers	Raindrops or Dewdrops	Ground of forest or woods	Air
6.	Acorns or seeds or mushrooms	Stream/pond	Tall trees with cavities	Small to medium area with deciduous woods (trees with leaves)
7.	Worms	Stream/pond	Nest in tree	Small area with woods, grass lawn, or field
8.	Flowers and grasses	Raindrops or dewdrops	Grasses and underside of leaves	Air
9.	Frogs or grasshoppers or mice	Stream/pond/ wetland	Stonewall or logs or shrubs	Small area with woods, fields, and wetlands
10.	Acorn or grasses or shrubs or small trees	Stream/pond/ wetland	Deciduous trees and conifer trees	Large space with woods, wetlands, and fields

All of the things you found in column 1 are food for wildlife. Write <u>Food</u> next to 1. Now figure out what to label 2, 3, and 4. using the words: <u>Water</u>, <u>Shelter</u>, <u>Space</u>.

Whose habitat needs are these?
